Message: "New Year, Fresh Start: New Clothes"

Scripture: Colossians 3:12-17 January 10, 2021

QUESTIONS TO CONSIDER...

- Are you a person who tends to keep clothes or do you give them away easily?
- In buying clothes, are you a name brand buyer? A bargain hunter? Style conscious? Spouse conscious? Or do you really not care what people think about your clothes?
- Read Colossians 3:1-17. What are the observations that you make? What might you title this section of Paul's letter to the Colossians?
- What is the way to a spiritual life? See Colossians 3:1-4 for clues as to how to be spiritual.
- What contrasts to do you see between the "clothes" of the "earthly nature" (vv. 5-11) and those of "God's chosen people" (vv. 12-17).
- What do you think it means to "clothe yourself" with the characteristics the "new wardrobe?"
- What is one thing that you can do to fit into the "new clothes" of the Christian?
