A WORD FROM PASTOR TIM



When Bad Things Happen

Back when my 4 kids were young, dinner preparations were always a juggling act. It meant that either my wife or I were in charge of making the dinner, while the other corralled the kids and encouraged them to help by getting carrots from the refrigerator, setting the table or picking up toys from around the house. It was always a little chaotic.

Usually, we had the television on and many times it meant that the local news was on air. On occasion that meant something bad happened in our world and was being reported. The initial reaction by my wife or me was to run and turn off the television or change the channel to a kid's program so our children wouldn't have to hear or see the bad event. That didn't always work and as they got older, questions got asked when bad things came across the television screen.

As I think of all that has transpired in our world the past month – a war in the Ukraine; a racially motivated shooting in Buffalo, NY; a politically motivated shooting at a church gathering in Orange County; a school

shooting at an elementary school in Uvalde, TX – I wonder like so many of us what is going on? How do I respond to tragedies? What do I say when something bad happens in our world and kids want to know why? These are good question to ask. Why do bad things happen and why does God allow bad things to happen?

Well, God is always saddened when bad things happen. He doesn't like it when there is sickness and death or when countries fight against each other. In a war, people on both sides are hurt. Property is destroyed, cities and neighborhoods are broken and families are sometimes separated. It breaks God's heart when this happens.

God wants us to be kind, to forgive, and to return meanness with kindness. He doesn't want us to bully others or to fight to get our way. He wants us to love others and sometimes that means we give up what we want.

So we need to follow God's advice both in bigworld events and when we are at home. Following God ways is always good. It may hurt doing things God's way. We may feel like we are begin taken advantage of but God's ways are always the right ways and they will always lead to peace, a peace that is ever lasting.

Know that I am praying for you, your family and for the conversations that you may be having.

MISSIONS SPOTLIGHT

This month our Mission spotlight is on the Ringenberg family (Dave, Linda and CJ) who serve with Mission Aviation Fellowship (MAF) in Papua, Indonesia; and also on our Prayer Quilt Ministry.

The Ringenberg's (Dave, Linda, CJ. And Ryan) – MAF Papua, Indonesia

Mission Aviation Fellowship (MAF) is a family of organizations led by missionaries in 37 countries around the world who have a vision of taking Christ's love into the most remote places on earth. The Ringenberg's (Dave and Linda) have been serving with MAF since 1998, the majority of their time spent serving in Indonesia.



After time spent at MAF Headquarters when their young daughter Hannah went home to be with the Lord in 2003, and the birth of their son, Ryan, God opened the door again in 2011 for them to accept a full-time position in Papua Indonesia. Currently serving in Sentani, Papua, Dave is serving as the Director of Operations for Indonesia. Linda stays involved with her family and community, and particularly enjoys organizing a weekly Bible study for MAF ladies. Several times a year she puts together a publication for the

MAF Papua team highlighting stories from the past months about how they are Connecting, Caring and Cultivating in Papua. She is also currently working on a book about all that the Lord taught her through Hannah's illness.

C.J. is attending Liberty University in Virginia and Ryan is active in high school. Below is an excerpt from their April Newsletter highlighting the Outdoor Education Program in which Ryan took part:

Each year since 1990 the entire high school of Hillcrest School has headed interior for Outdoor Education (OE). These students and their chaperones spend 12 days in a remote location doing work projects for the village, organizing kids clubs, teaching about HIV/AIDS through skits, showing the Jesus Film and interacting with people in the village.

This year was Ryan's first OE experience. Ryan says, "It was fun and challenging. We worked a lot. Although it took me out of my comfort zone, it helped me focus on spiritual things." The work project this year was lengthening the airstrip. MAF is very limited in how much weight they can take out of this village, and adding on to the airstrip will help solve this problem. The students were able to join with the villagers in carting dirt and rocks to the new airstrip area. Your prayers and support enable trips like OE to happen. the work that God is doing here in Papua!





Secondly, the recipient must give their permission for the quilt. If he/she is incapable of giving permission, the spouse, parent, or friend can give the permission.

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

As previously reported in the Session Highlights, we are in the process of developing a Flourishing Church Plan: At our May Session meeting, Pastor Tim led a discussion on desired areas for growth next year. Beginning in September, our initial focus will be on **Prayer**, with the following goals:

- To be a church that prays and is known for prayer.
- To cultivate a love of prayer as a means to connect with God and develop community.
- To learn about prayer in worship and small groups, in serving with others and in sharing the gospel.
- To nurture hearts and habits that value prayer.
- To encourage people to pray spontaneously; to be comfortable to pray in worship.
- To begin September with 40 days of Prayer, to include a sermon series on prayer, emphasis on prayer in Sunday school classes, small group participation, and other activities/events that focus on prayer.

The timeline for our church-wide focus on Prayer will begin September 2022 through August 2023.

Other highlights from our May Session meeting are highlighted below:

- 1. Approved the Prayer Quilt Ministry Fundraiser on October 16th, 2022 in classrooms 1 & 2. There will be no Adult Sunday School on that date.
- 2. Approved moving funds from our Checking Account into our Fidelity Investment account for 60 days, until a long-term investment plan is developed. \$250,000 will be kept in checking. A long-term plan will ensure that our money works for us.
- 3. Our ending financial report as of 30 April: -\$24,953.20. The good news is that our April report was \$316.88 in the black.

As Lakeside has grown up, we have changed from a simple ranching community to a larger suburb of San Diego. We have a large number of people going through changes in their lives: whether military being transferred here - who miss their families; senior citizens who are facing changes as they go into the next phase of their life; families transferred here to find affordable housing than in other parts of the county; and some who still see the closeness of the ranching community that we started as so long ago. As people move in, they may lose some of their social interaction, while others have lost a lot of social interaction over the last few years due to Covid.

As a church, we have a great opportunity to become a social center of the community again. We already have a great start with our Eat and Greet program, which is slowly starting to grow again after being shut down for Covid. Our free monthly outreach offers a safe place to gather for a couple of hours to enjoy food, fun, and social interaction

Some people may have the mistaken belief that the primary purpose of Eat and Greet is to feed the homeless. While we do have some homeless guest attending, I can assure you that we have a very diverse group of visitors, who have gathered in our facility to get to know new people, relax, and maybe win a small prize. In any case, guests have the opportunity to talk to somebody new.

Most of you have read your Bible and know that Jesus met most people where they were comfortable. Jesus often shared meals, and listened. I would like to challenge you to come to the next Eat and Greet, to have a meal, and listen to someone new. You may be amazed at what Jesus can do with two hours and a sandwich.

Your next opportunity will be on Sunday, June 26 at 12:15PM in the Fellowship Hall. We have flyers already available if that will make it easier for you to invite somebody.
