The first opportunity is to pray daily at three different times each day.

In the morning (when you awake),

a Prayer of Examen.

"We Love God, Love people, and Make disciples of Jesus"


Other highlights from our June Session meeting are highlighted below:

- 1. John Moser, Executive Presbyter, of San Diego Presbytery will be presenting an overview of "Casket Empty," an 18-week Bible study on the Old Testament that John co-authored with Carol Kaminski from Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary. This will take place during the Sunday school hour (11:00-12:00) on July 24th.
- 2. Adult Sunday school will not be convening during July and August, except for the above special class. Adult Sunday school will start again on September 18th.
- 3. Bibles will be presented on September 11th during the church service, to those going into Elementary School and Middle School (including those we missed during the Pandemic).
- 4. From Spiritual Life Committee:

## Mission Spotlight

This month our spotlight is on two missions:

- 1. Our Supported Missionary Family: Leona and Jennifer Edic (through Literacy & Evangelism International; and
- 2. Military Outreach Ministry (MOM)

#### **Literacy & Evangelism International**

The Edic Literacy and Education Ministry has been God's mission field for the Edic family, that started over thirty years ago by Rev. Don and Leona Edic. Since Pastor Don passed away in 2021, Leona and Jennifer Edic's current work continues in Benin with the Awolou family (Literacy Benin) through Literacy and Evangelism International. God's ministry through the work of the Edic family is about empowering others through education opportunities and using education to share the Gospel's message of love, hope, and gift of eternal life.

From Jennifer Edic: In March I was approached to help a non-profit organization develop an English language center in a rural area of Columbia. This work is in the initial stages and is an exciting chance for us to bring new curriculum and Christian outreach to this project. Please pray for ongoing planning. "...Helping education organizations across the nation and the world is really the melding of our ministry with Literacy & Evangelism International (LEI) and my experience in education..."

#### **Prayer Requests:**

- 1. Praise that Leona has fully recovered from a broken wrist and is now "back in full swing" with her Bible studies.
- 2. Pray for the trip Jennifer has scheduled to Benin in October to work with the Awolou family in the northern part of Benin.
- 3. Pray that plans for education outreach to women and mothers can take place in addition to our help with the literacy work being done in this region.

## **Military Outreach Ministries (MOM)**

MOM's mission is to serve the population of junior enlisted military in San Diego County with basic needs that help to stretch their limited funds while they live in one of the most expensive areas in the country. Services are free of charge in appreciation for their service and consist of: (1) the distribution of food at military housing and holiday meals in November and December, (2) allowing families to shop at their Distribution Center for baby items, children's clothes, and household items, (3) helping families feel a sense of community, especially spouses of deployed members, by holding special events such as baby showers, Christmas Stores, Easter egg hunts, back to school backpacks drive, and (4) helping during personal emergencies.

Pray that servant hearts within our congregation continue to support MOMs by providing baby layettes through the Prayer Quilt Ministry, donating to Thanksgiving meal boxes, and volunteering to help host the annual Christmas store in December.
