A WORD FROM PASTOR TIM

A Praying Church

I have good memories of the start of a school year. Maybe your experience was similar to mine.

It meant for me and my brother and my sister that my mom would pile us into the station wagon and go shopping for new school clothes, new shoes and school supplies for the school year. We always shopped at May Co. (a big department in Los Angeles) for our clothes and Savon for the school supplies. I remember that for many years, I would end up with a new pair of Levi straight-legged 501 blue jeans and a pair of Jack Purcell tennis shoes and I won't forget that we always got "Pee-Chee" folders for classes. These were the standards for a kid growing up in Los Angeles.

Those memories remind me that the month of September always seems to be the start of a new year, and a fresh start. I know that it goes back to those years as a student and then continued as I was the father of 4 kids and getting them ready for a school year.

As we prepare for September and the start of our church's year, I wanted to tell you about something that we will be doing through-out the upcoming 2022/2023 year.

Back in **June**, the Session of LCPC thought about what steps we should take to being a thriving, healthy, flourishing church. We want to live our mission of **Loving God, Loving People and Making Disciples of Jesus.** A healthy church is one that (Continued)

is a vibrant church and one of the key aspects of a vibrant church is that it is a **praying church**.

For the upcoming year we are going to place an emphasis on prayer.

Prayer is an essential part of our relationship with God, both personally and as a faith community. We want this spiritual exercise to be an integral characteristic of our lives and of our church.

Here is how you can participate and help our church be a praying church:

- Daily Everyday at 8:30am, set your alarm and pause to pray. Make it a time both thanking God, petitioning God and listening to God. Being still before God is an essential part of being a disciple of Christ and this daily discipline will help in your spiritual growth. If 8:30am is not a convenient time for you, pick another time during the day when you can spend 30 minutes being quite with God.
- Weekly Every Sunday, before the LCPC worship service at 9:30am, Elders and Deacons will gather in the Pastor's office to offer prayers for the upcoming worship service and any needs that may be of concern. Everyone is welcome to join in this time as we prepare for worship. I also want to remind you that after each service, there are Prayer Ministers that are there to

pray with you if you have a need or if you want to pray for the need of someone else. (If you are at home watching the service, pause with us at 9:30am and pray with us before the service while you are at home.)

- Monthly Every month in the LCPC Connections Newsletter you will find a written prayer that you can make a part of your prayer routine. It could be said at the start of the day, at a meal, before going to bed or sometime during your day (like before a daily walk). It will be a resource to help you in your prayer life.
- Quarterly We will gather together on a quarterly basis for a **Service of Prayer and Healing**. The Psalms will be our guide as we lift up prayers in word, in song, in silence and as we pray for healing in our lives and in the lives of those that we know are in need. These will take place in **October** (Wed., Oct. 19 @ 7:00pm), **February**, **May**, & **July**.
- Yearly During Lent of 2023, we will have a 24-Hour Prayer Vigil where for 24 hours we will be in continual prayer for our personal needs, for the needs of our church and for the needs of our world. Details will come out as we approach the Season of Lent.

I hope that our focus on prayer in the upcoming 2022/2023 year will be a key aspect of our church being a healthy, vibrant church that seeks to **Love God, Love People and Make Disciples of Jesus**.

THIS MONTH WE ARE PRAYING FOR EAT AND GREET!

Each month, we encourage our church family to pray for particular missionaries and other programs that we help to support. During the month of September, we are lifting up our Eat and Greet program in prayer.

Eat and Greet is designed as a meal program for the community at large. Our goal is to reach out and offer assistance to the homeless, the neighbors who are alone, and those who are having some challenges regardless of housing status. We want to welcome all walks of life. We want to be available to those who may be searching to start or restart their relationship with God, but do not feel comfortable attending church.

There are many examples in the Bible of using a simple meal to develop or strengthen relationships. Whether feeding 5000 men or 12 disciples, Christ used meals to connect with and get to know people right where they are.

Eat and Greet meets at 12:15 PM on the last Sunday of the month in the Fellowship Hall. We serve a themed meal; offer a short devotional; we enjoy good conversations; and fun, animated bingo games. We are not licensed to offer prizes for bingo, but our guests receive door prizes.

Our church family is encouraged to attend the luncheons and minister to our neighbors while conversing and enjoying time together.

Our guests are able to make prayer requests at our luncheon, and they greatly appreciate knowing that others are praying for the concerns burdening them. Prayers are similar to any of ours: requests for relatives and friends facing illnesses, seeking employment, and those needing affordable housing.

Additionally, we can always use white elephant donations for our door prize table. Your contribution to our program brings joyful smiles to those who receive them.

- 1. Overall Giving is UP nearly \$7000 from 2021.
- 2. Overall Expenses are DOWN \$4000 from 2021.
- 3. End Balance of \$40,644 July 2021.

Summary: We are grateful for your [the Congregation's] continued financial support. The Session and Committees have been prudent in their spending while our ministry in Lakeside is growing. Work is underway to develop an Investment policy and portfolio, funded using some of the monies from the sale of the Day Care houses. We are also working on getting bids to address our Infrastructure issues like roofing, plumbing, parking lot, ADA bathrooms, energy saving, sanctuary carpet, painting, tree trimming, the Steeple, zero scaping the sign area and others. Once the bids are received the items will be prioritized by the Session and work will begin to upgrade our Church facility.

Again, THANK YOU for your continued support of our Lord's work here at LCPC. Not just for finances, but also for all your volunteer hours helping the church doing the work He has placed before us. We are His hands and feet. Let us continue in our walk with Jesus each day. To Him be the glory!

FROM OUR MISSIONARIES: PRAISE AND PRAYER

Dave & Linda Ringenberg (MAF, Sentani Papua):

Praise

- We praise God for the new MAF airplane, PK-MJL, that they affectionally refer to as "Miss Joyce Lin" in memory of the pilot and team member they lost last May.
- Praise the Lord that Linda and Ryan's trip to the States went well and for time spent with family.
- Praise God for great MAF teammates!

Praver

- Pray for the safety f our pilots, planes and our team here in Papua
- Pray for wisdom in training our new pilots
- Pray for C.J. as he begins his senior year at Liberty college.
- Pray for the SLH (Lantern of Hope) schools interior as they continue to grow and prepare for the new school year. MAF is privileged to support a solid Christian education for Papuan children interior.

Steve and Debbie Robinson (MAF, Headquarters):

From Steve: "... I would like to share with you about some things that are happening in the landlocked African country of Lesotho (Luh-soo-too), which is known as the "Mountain Kingdom" as the entire country is quite mountainous and travel by road is difficult at best. MAF's chief role is giving wings to the Lesotho Flying Doctor Service and the Flying Pastor Program..." MAF is also spearheading along with other national and international missionaries a thrust to bring a Christian school to the community of Kuebunyane, Lesotho where there is no school at all.

Prayer:

- Continue to pray for the Flying Doctor Service so that Medical teams can be flown into very remote village clinics and for many medical emergency evacuation flights.
- Pray for the Flying Pastor Program supporting pastors from the capital city of Masaru,
 Lesotho, as they seek to bring the light of the Gospel to very remote villages where there is no other witness.
- Pray for the new Christian School in Kuebunyane that they can prepare primary students for success vocationally in their rural community or for secondary schooling in town. Pray that this can be a model for pairing Christian schooling with the Pastoral work already being done by the Lesotho Flying Pastors in other villages.
- Prayer for safe flying of Pastors in other villages. Over the years I [Steve] have
 evaluated and trained the national maintenance specialists and most of the
 pilot/mechanic missionaries there in Lesotho. Through your support and prayers for
 us, in a very real sense you are touching many lives in remote, and isolated, mountain
 villages of Lesotho. We pray that many more lives will be touched by the awesome
 power in Jesus' name.

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

The following provides highlights and actions from our August 23rd Session Meeting:

- 1. Guest Speaker John Savidge, Director of 1st Pres. Ladle Fellowship, met with Session to talk about a Health Care Ministry to provide care for the homeless and vulnerable adults on the streets. One of their goals is to provide an East County presence. This would require a host church or group of churches to support. This was just an informational meeting and will require a lot of discussion and coordination with other churches if this would be something we could take on.
- 2. The church received a gift from Reginald Warren's Estate in the amount of \$5765.75. Money is going into the undesignated memorial account until Session approves a way in which the money can be used to honor Reginald.
- 3. Session approved a "New Members" class that will be held on October 23rd and October 30th after church in the Pastor's office. On November 6th new members will be welcomed and presented to the congregation.
- 4. Annual Congregation meeting is scheduled for November 13th. On the Agenda will be to approve the slate of Officers (Deacons and Elders) for Class of 2025. The budget for 2023 will be presented for review, as well as the pastor's compensation package for approval by the congregation.
- 5. New California Statute AB 506 is to be implemented for all "Youth Servicing Organizations." It is a mandated reporting statute for reporting child abuse. All churches/non-profit organizations are included in this mandate. The main components that affect us are 1) annual training for all staff and regular volunteers; 2) background checks through Live Scan for all staff and regular volunteers, and 3) initial 6 hours training for all staff/2 hours for all regular volunteers. The definition of a regular volunteer is someone who works with children/youth 16 hours per month or 32 hours per year. Right now, the definition of "Regular Volunteer" will include the 2 Sunday School teachers. It is mandatory for all staff rather or not you have direct contact with youth.
- 6. Time changes for church service on Christmas Day and New Year's Day: 11:00AM. No Sunday school on those days.
- 7. An Investment sub-committee has been established under the leadership of the Stewardship/Property committee. They will be looking at Investment policies to maximize returns on our investments now and for the future.
- 8. Session approved funds in the amount of \$600 to "solarize" the Sign area.
- 9. Session approved \$650 (from facilities fund) to replace failed AC in Children Center's Office.
- 10. With sadness, Session approved moving Maeve Hall from the church militant to the church triumphant. Maeve went home to be with the Lord on August 7th.
- 11. Budget Year to Date: -\$29,726.67. It should be noted that individual giving is up over last year. Attendance has been averaging 60 attendees in worship with an average of 21 viewing on-line (this varies week to week).
