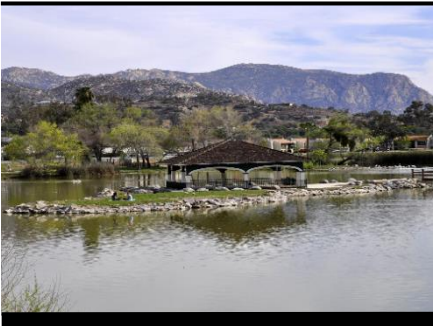

Our monthly Eat and Greet luncheons continue to draw new friends from our community.

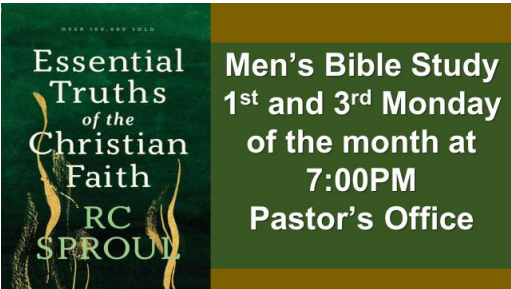
Even though the holidays are very busy time for most of us, we feel that it is important to keep developing these relationships.

THANKSGIVING FOOD BASKETS FOR SAN DIEGO MILITARY OUTREACH MINISTRIES (SDMOM)
