A WORD FROM PASTOR TIM

Knowing Jesus

Knowing Jesus helps us to know God. The better we know the Jesus of the Scriptures, the better we will know the God of the universe and we will trust Him more with our lives.

I know that for many of us, we have known Jesus for a long time, but sometimes our familiarity with the stories of Jesus allows us to miss the truth of who He really is. Knowing the back story and knowing the true Son of God will help us to see Him clearly so that we can know Him more fully and follow Him more completely.

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

May has been a busy month as we continue with upgrades throughout our church property, and increased focus on ministry priorities. Church attendance has been up, and we are welcoming new visitors on Sunday mornings. The following provides highlights and actions from Session:

- 1. A wonderful time was had by all at our Sunday Morning Worship, at Lindo Lake Park on May 21st. The weather was beautiful, and the geese were out in force. Thank you to all who helped with set-up and tear-down. It was a lot of work, but much appreciated.
- 2. Session is continuing to look at core values of our church to support our 90-day, 1-year and 5-year ministry goals.
- 3. Session approved adding two additional holidays to the calendar: Juneteenth (June19th); and Easter Monday (the day after Easter). Office will be closed on those days.
- 4. Session approved Property Services Plus to fix slab leak in the patio area at a cost of \$3443.93, to come out of Major Maintenance.
- 5. Replaced all Paper Towel Dispensers. Thank you to Joe Conard for his work on this.
- 6. Work Party in June to replace shed roofs. Shed near Fellowship Hall repair approved by Session NTE \$6,000.
- 7. Session hopes to start soon with Xeriscaping project scraping the top layer of weeds and soil around the sign area. Stewardship & Property to seek bids for an Electronic Sign.
- 8. Active Shooter training for key personnel scheduled for June 11th (after Sunday School meeting and Deacons meeting suggested.) Anyone interested is welcome to attend.
- 9. There is an uneven sidewalk area near our sign that is posing a trip hazard (Someone has already fallen there.) A leveling compound will be used on this area, and other areas as appropriate, to ensure that church walkways do not pose a safety hazard for our congregation.
- 10. Session is discussing office reconfiguration to establish a space for meetings/conferences. Financial Report as of the end of April: **-\$13.038.15**

WEBSITE, FACEBOOK, INSTAGRAM by, Sheila King

Last month I wrote an article on how LCPC utilizes social media to reach others, either as a first time introduction to our church, or as a means to view pictures that present insights into our church's activities.

The website, <u>www.lakesidepc.org</u>, provides up to date information, sermons, Pastor's Blog, church calendar, various ministries within our church, prayer requests, Preschool, LCPC library, volunteer opportunities, and links to Biblegateway and the The Bible Project. Within the past 30 days the top 10 countries viewing our website pages have been from: United States (from Washington State to Maine and everywhere in between), Canada, United Kingdom, Singapore, Switzerland, Ireland, Germany, Mexico, South Africa and Australia. Yes, our little church is internationally known! Taking advantage of social media is just another way our church can share who Jesus is to the world and His impact in our lives.

Since March the number of followers to LCPC's Facebook (FB) has grown to 473, with the majority of followers are living in Lakeside, followed by San Diego, El Cajon, Santee and Bostonia. Knowing this information allows us to reach out and invite our followers to church, participate in our ministries (Bible studies, Prayer Quilt, Eat and Greet to name just a few). Having a follower is nice, but you don't have to officially follow our FB page, you can simply view Facebook. Just within the past 30 days we had 539 people view our FB site. The more people that visit, the more likely they will visit us and join us as we grow in our walk with the Lord.

Our Instagram (LCPC9) platform has grown to 99 followers, but again you don't have to follow in order to view our reels and photos. In fact our Instagram page reached 544 accounts (504 people were non-followers) in the past 30 days. Just like our FB platform, the more people that visit, the more likely they will come and visit us.

A personal invitation to come to church is always preferred, but social media is a valuable tool when used responsibly and provides LCPC an economical method of informing and inviting others to church. THE LAKESIDE CHRISTIAN HELPS CENTER CONTINUES TO SHOW CHRIST WORKING IN OUR COMMUNITY

The Lakeside Christian HELPS Center is a combined effort of the churches of the Lakeside area. They provide food, clothing, and other assistance to homeless and to those who need a little extra help to get them through the week.

Many clients are working families, so our church has made it possible to open the Center one Saturday each month to assist these families get the help they need.

The Center depends on food and clothing contributions from area churches and other non-profit organizations. Lakeside Community Presbyterian Church has used the Center to teach our young people about giving through the Sunday School Peanut Butter and Jelly Club.

Donations may be dropped off at the Center during their operating hours, or at the church office during office hours, as well as on Sundays in the foyer.

If you would like to know more about the Center, please contact Michael McKnight, Gary MacDonald or Joy Wray. All donations including food, clothes, time, or money, help the Center to get people through challenging times.

HOW SCRIP GIFT CARDS HELP

Currently, we have an average of ten people and groups that order gift cards through our program which means that we earn an average of \$100.00 per month on commissions. Patrons pay face value, and the church receives commissions that can be as high as 15%!

The money goes towards pay for special projects being worked on around the church. Funds are currently going towards the renovation of the ground around our marquis sign.

If half of our church were to support the scrip card orders to any of the many retailers such as Walmart, Home Depot, Amazon, Arco Gas, Albertsons, Starbucks, Applebee's, or any other of the over 400 different brands that are available, we could double our commission and get more projects completed.

This will make our campus a bright light in our community.

DID YOU KNOW.....

Our church office and leadership work diligently to inform and communicate church updates and events and yet we often hear that a person did not know when we have special events, or when ministries meet such as the Prayer Quilt Ministry who meets (Monday at 10am, Room 1 & 2), Men's Bible Study (1st and 3rd Monday at 7pm, Room 1), Women's Bible Study (Monday at 3pm, Pastor's Office), Eat and Greet (last Sunday of the month at 12:15pm, Fellowship Hall), or they are not aware of volunteer needs, etc.

Even though we strive to communicate church news in a variety of ways we recognize there is always something we can do better. If you see a gap in what we communicate or a way we can improve communication we encourage you to submit your suggestion to the church office.
