A WORD FROM PASTOR TIM

A Praying Church

It has been a year since we as a church made the commitment to be a praying church. It was September 2022 that we wanted to make a concerted effort to be a people who prayed and be a church that was known for prayer. This year we are going to commit to that again.

As we begin a new ministry year this Fall, would you be willing to be a person who prays? Here are some ways that you can be involved:

- **Be a Prayer Warrior** On a daily basis we receive requests for prayer from people in our congregation and people from the community, and each prayer is sent to our Prayer Warrior Team. If you would like to be added to the team and receive email updates let the church office know and we will get you on the email list.
- Be an After Service Prayer Minister After each Sunday service we offer an opportunity for people to receive prayer, whether it is for a personal prayer, prayers for a family member or a prayer for a friend. We want to be praying for one another. If you would like to be a part of the After Service **Prayer Team** talk to Pastor Tim and he will get you on the list and into the rotation.

• Participate in the 24-Hour **Prayer Vigil** – On October 13 & 14, for 24-hours, we will be praying. We are asking that you sign-up for a 30-minute prayer slot starting at 9:00am on Friday, October 13 through 9:00am, Saturday, October 14. You can pray from home or if you would like, you can come to the church during the day on Friday between 9am-2pm and pray in the LCPC Sanctuary. More details on signups will take place during September and October leading up to the Vigil.

Being a church that prays is important as we continue to be a part of God's Kingdom Work here in Lakeside, East County and around the world.

"Yet give attention to Your servant's prayer and his plea for mercy, Lord my God. Hear the cry and the prayer that your servant is praying in your presence this day." 1 Kings 8:28

MINISTRY FAIR - SEPTEMBER 10TH

NEW MINISTRY COMING

Prayer is such an important aspect of our worship at LCPC. We are a praying church, have a Prayer Quilt Ministry, offer online prayer requests, and have a team of prayer warriors who receive daily prayer requests from the office. It is only fitting that as we continue to grow in our walk with the Lord and that we have a Prayer Ministry. A separate ministry provides an opportunity for LCPC to be more intentional about prayer and not "get lost" among our other ministries. This ministry may want to create Prayer Partners, specific Prayer Meetings, Prayer Retreats, Special Prayer vigils, Prayer breakfasts, to name just some of the ideas.

Our first step is to ask everyone to Pray. Go to the Father and ask Him for guidance and wisdom as we seek to form this new ministry. NEW DAY 14TH ANNUAL 2023 GOLF 4 GOOD



Matthew 8:23-27 Jesus Calms the Storm

23 Then He got into the boat and His disciples followed Him. 24 Suddenly a furious storm came up on the lake, so that the waves swept over the boat. But Jesus was sleeping. 25 The disciples went and woke Him, saying, "Lord, save us! We're going to drown!"

26 He replied, "You of little faith, why are you so afraid?" Then He got up and rebuked the winds and the waves, and it was completely calm.

27 The men were amazed and asked, "What kind of Man is this? Even the winds and the waves obey Him!"

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

The following provides highlights and actions from Session:

- 1. Pastor Tim continues to lead Session in reviewing and monitoring progress on our 90-day, 1-year and 5-year ministry goals.
- 2. Session accepted Shawn Santos' resignation with regret at the end of June, and welcomed La Teresa Oropeza on August 1st. She comes to us with a lot of experience in faith-based early education that has covered over thirty years; she has been a Preschool Director for twelve years. She will be introduced to the congregation on August 27th. Session thanked Shirley Wilson for providing financial and payroll assistance to the Children's Center during the transition.
- 3. Session approved a new audio system. Installation took place the week of August 14th, and included a new audio board, amplifier and new speakers. This equipment will enhance the audio on our streaming service, and the new audio-enhancement system will be helpful for those who have a hard time hearing during the service. This has been a long time coming, and will greatly improve the sound quality during Worship. Many thanks go to the Sound Image team and the LCPC sound team for their hard work.
- 4. Session approved the renovation of the Pastor's former Office into a new "Fireside Room." The Pastor moved into the smaller office, previously used for general staff use. This provides a welcoming environment for Sunday morning fellowship. Funds came from a generous donation from the Prayer Quilt Ministry of \$1,000 and funds previously donated for the Narthex/ADA bathroom upgrade (\$4,000). Thank you to Sheila King for directing and managing this move.
- 5. Upcoming Events:
 - Approved supporting the Operation Christmas Child (through Samaritan Purse). This will be a church-wide project with a goal of creating 100 Operation Christmas Child boxes and raising \$1600 for shipping and providing 12 Gospel lessons: "The Greatest Journey", for 100 children. We will be meeting as a congregation on November 4th from 10:00AM to 1:00PM in fellowship Hall for packaging the boxes. Look for the display in the Narthex and for future announcements in the church bulletin.
 - Approved hosting of a Chamber of Commerce breakfast on <u>September 8th</u>.
 - Approved a Ministry Fair on <u>September 10th</u>.
 - Approved a Congregational meeting on <u>November 19th</u>. Elders and Deacons will be elected for Class of 2026.
 - Approved Pastor Bob Mentze to preach on **Sunday**, October 8th.
 - Approved a Prayer Quilt Fundraiser on October 15th.
 - Approved a New Member class on October 22nd and 29th
- 6. Session approved support for Kingdom Builders (Pastor Daniel Nunez' church planting) in the amount of \$10,000. Funds to come out of monies allocated for Missions from the sale of the Day Care houses.
- 7. Session approved a donation in the amount of \$2500 for Disaster Relief in support of the Maui fires. Donation will be made through Samaritan Purse. Funds to come from C100, Unallocated Reserves.
- 8. Current financial report: As of July 31st: -\\$17,225.26.

OUR CHURCH LIBRARY – REVIEW OF YOUR GOD IS TOO SMALL BY J.B. PHILLIPS

Did you know that our Church library has over 1400 books...Classics from leading theologians (past and present), fiction, non-fiction, biographies and much more. The church library is important to study for the individual and the congregation. The library supports the mission of the church as well as the growth of individual members' faith.

Paul wrote to Timothy, "When you come, bring the cloak that I left with Carpus at Troas, also the books, and above all, the parchments." 2 Timothy 4:13. Paul had need of books: how much more the growing Christian of today needs the stimulus of books for reference, for Bible study, for inspiration in Christian living!

This month, we are highlighting J.B. Phillips classic, "Your God is Too Small." This book is one that challenges the reader to redefine their understanding of our Creator God, without the labels and constraints that often limits our idea of God. The author writes how we may view God as the "Resident Policeman," that still small voice that makes us feel quilty and unhappy before, during and after our wrong behavior. Or "God is the "Grand Ole Man", who is treated with respect and reverence but can hardly be expected to cope with the complex world we live in today. Or "God in a Box," a God that is "tamed and trained" to our own liking. We attempt to force a majestic God into little man-made boxes, with neat labels designed to make sense to our world.

This is a book that has made a tremendous impact in my faith walk, one that I have read over and over again. It is always tempting to make God "one of us," to explain the mystery and majesty of a God in ways that fit into our understanding of the world. This over forty-year old classic is for skeptics and believers alike. It continues to challenge me and is an encouragement to all those who want to know who God is and what he is like. As J.B. Phillips notes in his intro:

"If it is true that there is Someone in charge of the whole mystery of life and death, we can hardly expect to escape a sense of futility and frustration until we begin to see what he is like and what his purposes are."


In our library, we have two copies of "Our God is Too Small." Stop by and check it out, along with all the books we have on our shelves.

Yes - Give a "WOW" item soccer ball (not inflated) with hand pump, stuffed animal, shoes, doll; Personal Care: toothbrush, washcloth, comb, hairbrush, small empty plastic bottle; School supplies: pens, pencils, sharpeners, crayons, markers, notebooks, coloring books, picture books, solar calculators;

Accessories: socks, sunglasses, jewelry, watches, flashlights (with extra batteries).

No - Do not give toothpaste, used or damaged items, scary or war-related items, no food, no candy, no lotions or liquids, no vitamins, no glass containers or aerosol cans.

Again....Saturday, November 4th at 10AM we will meet in the Fellowship Hall and together we will make the boxes followed by pizza and refreshments for everyone.

Of course you are always welcomed to fill a box and return the filled box to the church, but we understand filling a box can be costly, not to mention our goal of raising \$16.00 per box for shipping and 12 classes for 100 children. Therefore, consider giving a small item and placing it in the collection box. Your item will become part of our overall collection for the large packing day.

Or donate money to be used for the shipping/classes or for LCPC to purchase items. Please make your check payable to LCPC and in the note field write: OCC (Operation Christmas Child). You can also make a donation using the church ONLINE Giving by going to www.lakesidepc.org. Online Giving is a secure site. The Giving page provides a dropdown field for the type of fund, such as Tithes, Deacons, OCC, Memorial etc. Click on OCC and make your donation. You will receive an online confirmation thank you and our Treasurer receives a weekly and monthly report that lists all online giving including the designated funds you selected. Online giving accepts Credit Cards, Debit Cards, and GooglePay.

This may seem like a lot to ask, but always begin with prayer. Pray about how and what you can do to be an active missionary in our church's participation in OCC. Pray that our gifts, given in the spirit of Christian love be used in a way to demonstrate our love of Christ and people. Pray that through these gifts, we can along with the field volunteers teach the children, parents and villages of God's Word.
