

A WORD FROM PASTOR TIM

Active Waiting

Waiting is a difficult thing.

As a child, waiting can be especially difficult if what you are waiting for is something that is exciting! Christmas day, a birthday party or a trip to Disneyland can bring sleepless nights of excited anticipation before the big day arrives.

Sometimes as adults, we wait with anticipated excitement for something that we have wanted to do, like going to dinner with friends at a restaurant or going on an upcoming vacation. But getting older does not necessarily mean that waiting is easier. In fact, as we get older, we settle down into a routine and sometimes don't like to wait, especially if it involves something that is new.

In our spiritual lives, waiting is essential. We wait as we anticipate that God is at work, moving in the midst of our lives and in the midst of our world. We believe in a God who is alive.

So as we wait, we do so actively.

Our anticipation that God is at work involves our activity. We engage with God through prayer, through

reading His Word and through worship with His people. Sometimes our activity involves being quiet and silent. We interact with our world, doing God's kingdom work with other believers, with our neighbors and especially with those that are on the margins of our world.

So our waiting is not empty waiting, it is active, alert, and anticipates that our God is on the move.

During this Advent Season, as we wait to celebrate the birth of Jesus and the coming of God incarnate, may we do so actively, engaging with God and engaging with His Word and engaging in His World, anticipating that He will be doing things amongst us.

NEW ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASS December 3,10 and 17

This year, beginning December 3, we will begin a 3-week study on Handel's Messiah using an abridged performance by the Academy of Ancient Music, held at the chapel of Trinity College, Cambridge. Messiah is an Englishlanguage oratorio composed in 1741 by George Friedrich Handel, using scriptural text exclusively. Handel composed the Messiah in 24 days and his servants reported he was often in tears as he composed. When King George II attended a royal performance of Messiah, he stood up for the Hallelujah Chorus in honor of the King of kings. When the king stood, everyone in his presence had to stand. So, it became the tradition for the audience to stand up when the Hallelujah Chorus is sung.

Each week we will show about 30 minutes of the performance, followed with a discussion of the Biblical text, which will be provided. Please join us each Sunday at 11:00 as we prepare our hearts this Advent season, reflecting on the Scriptural passages that foretold and proclaim our Messiah, the Lord Jesus Christ.



ADA RESTROOM

For sometime we have been working to get quotes to convert the Narthex restroom into a quiet area and accommodate an ADA restroom, additionally we want to upgrade the existing Fellowship Hall restroom to be ADA compliant. The two areas were selected as they would require the least amount of remodel and accommodate areas that see the greatest number of congregation, guests and preschool activity. Sadly, we had to tell several Eat & Greet guests that we cannot accommodate their wheelchair in any restroom. As a church we are to be inviting and welcoming to all, yet the current state of our building tells a different story when those with disabilities are unable to use a restroom.

Our efforts to rectify the situation have been challenging. We previously contacted several contractors, who no-bid the job. We are currently working with another contractor to provide us a bid and their attention to detail and multiple visits to our campus is encouraging. One of the challenges we face is that our campus was built in an era that did not accommodate people with disabilities and therefore the county may require further upgrades unrelated to a restroom remodel. We have made some updates over the years, but working with a reputable contractor familiar with codes and permit requirements is crucial to a safe environment.

We will continue to keep you informed as we navigate to bring an ADA restroom to our campus.
