A WORD FROM PASTOR TIM The Centrality of the Cross

Walk into the sanctuary of Lakeside Community Presbyterian Church and one of the things that you first notice is the cross. In fact, there are 6 different crosses that are visible. I don't know the purpose of the placement of each of the crosses but I suspect that the cross is to be at the center of our sanctuary, central to our worship. It speaks volumes about our church and our faith.

The earliest Christians didn't use a cross as a symbol of its faith. The New Testament church tended to use a dove, a peacock (to symbolize eternal life), an athlete's victory palm, the Chi-Rho monogram or a fish (ichthys). It wasn't until the 2nd century, after the Roman Emperor Constantine had a vision, that the cross became a symbol of Christendom. Here is the story behind that Constantine's vision.

On the eve of the Battle of Milvian Bridge, Constantine had a vision in which he saw a flaming cross in the sky, along with the words "in hoc signo vinces" (with this sign you shall conquer). Upon his victorious battle, Constantine adopted the cross as his emblem and the empire, and Christendom followed.

Over the two millennium of Christendom, the cross has become the symbol of the Christian church. It represents and memorializes Christ's death:

• The cross is a reminder of the cruel and gruesome execution that Christ faced on our behalf.

- The cross reminds us of His atonement for our sins.
- The cross reminds us that He died on our behalf, the perfect sacrifice for the sins of humanity.
- The cross also reminds us of His resurrection from the dead. His conquering of death, and of eternal life.

This year, as we come to another Holy Week and Easter, may the cross remind us of Christ's death. of His sacrifice for our sins.

- May we offer up prayers of gratitude for what He did on the cross.
- May we offer up our lives to Him as a living sacrifice, a response for what He has done.
- May we share what Christ has done to our family and friends who need to hear the Good News that Christ has risen.



BOOK REVIEW The Good & Beautiful Community By James Bryant Smith

For the past few months in worship, we have been following the chapters in the James Bryant Smith's book, <u>The Good & Beautiful Community</u>, as an outline for the characteristics of a church. We were looking at what should be the defining aspects of a faith community that make it distinctive, reflecting on the characteristic of God as we follow the Spirit, extend grace and demonstrate love?

This is the third book in a series that is entitled *The Apprentice Series*. It follows the progression of two books. The first book, <u>The Good and Beautiful God</u>, examines the true narratives about God. Its purpose is to align our thoughts with Jesus' thoughts about God, seeking to "*fall in love with the God Jesus knows*." The second book of the series, <u>The Good and Beautiful Life</u>, deals with the character and virtues of a Christ-follower. It uses Jesus' **Sermon on the Mount** as a springboard for examining our lives in Christ. There is a fourth book, <u>The Good and Beautiful You</u>, that seeks to be a book that helps us to "love ourselves." All of the books, come from a starting point of living out Christ's expression on the greatest commandment from the Gospels:

"You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' This is the greatest and first commandment. And the second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' On these commandments hang all the law and the prophets."

(Matthew 22:35-40; Mark 12:28-34; Luke 10:27)

Each of the chapters from <u>The Good and Beautiful Community</u> focuses upon a different characteristic of a faith community that follows Jesus:

- We are a Peculiar Community A characteristic of a good and beautiful community that follows Jesus that is set apart (or holy), and we offer "peculiar acts" of love to each other and to our world.
- We are a Hopeful Community Because we are connected to Jesus and His ways, we have a hope that is beyond this world. But this hope that is future-oriented also effects the way that we live our lives today, sharing God's hope to our hurting world.
- We are a Serving Community Christ's demonstration of coming to serve rather than being served is our model and a characteristic of the Christ-following community.
- We are a Christ-Centered Community Christ is at the center of all that we do. We are to be a community whose hearts beat in our love for Jesus. (Continued on page 6)

- We are a Reconciling Community Our forgiveness in Christ carries over to our relationships. We are to be a people who are willing to forgive because of what Christ has done for us.
- We are an Encouraging Community Our connectedness carries over into our relationships. We need to be a community that is connected to one another, learning from one another, holding each other accountable and encouraging one another as we go through life.
- We are a Generous Community The mark of a Christian community that follows Christ is one that is generous. We believe and trust in a God who provides for all of our needs so we hold loosely our possessions, looking for ways to serve and to meet the needs of others.
- We are a Worshiping Community The focus of our gathering is to give praise and adoration to Christ. He is the center of our worship, and our worship is in preparation for eternity with Him in heaven. We also serve Him, and His kingdom, in our world today.

Another unique aspect of the Apprentice Series books is the inclusion of **Soul Training Exercises** that seek to help us through indirect means, grow in our loving relationship with God, with ourselves, and with others.

The final thing to say about this book is that it is a great book to read with others. There are discussion questions for each chapter that help you to engage with the content of the book and with the soul training exercises. This is the best way to understand the material in the book and grow in our relationship with God and with each other.





24-HOUR PRAYER VIGIL FOR OUR NEIGHBORS MARCH 15 & 16

During the Season of Lent, we have been praying daily for our neighbors. Now, with Easter approaching at the end of the month, we are going to be praying for 24 Hours, for our neighbors.
